CHTh yn nodi Wythnos Ymwybyddiaeth Ymddygiad Gwrthgymdeithasol 2023

Addawodd y Comisiynydd Heddlu a Throsedd (CHTh) Andy Dunbobbin ei gefnogaeth i Wythnos Ymwybyddiaeth Ymddygiad Gwrthgymdeithasol gyda thaith gerdded o gwmpas y Rhyl, i glywed mwy am sut mae swyddogion lleol yn y dref yn gweithio i leihau ymddygiad gwrthgymdeithasol a mathau eraill o droseddau yn y dref.

Diffinnir ymddygiad gwrthgymdeithasol fel ymddygiad lle mae gweithrediadau unigolyn neu grŵp yn achosi annifyrrwch, dioddefaint neu drafferth i unigolyn neu grŵp penodol neu'r gymuned ehangach. Gall enghreifftiau gynnwys fandaliaeth, niwsans gyda cherbydau, yfed yn y stryd ac ymddygiad amhriodol gan gymdogion.

Arweiniwyd y Comisiynydd ar daith gerdded o amgylch canol y dref gan yr Arolygydd Kevin Smith o Heddlu Gogledd Cymru. Cafodd hefyd gwmni'r Cyngorydd Rhys Thomas, Aelod Arweiniol Tai a Chymunedau ar Gyngor Sir Ddinbych. Trafododd y tri'r darlun trosedd cyffredinol yn ardal Sir Ddinbych Arfordirol, sydd wedi gweld gostyngiad cyson a chroesawgar mewn troseddau dros y misoedd diwethaf.

Police and Crime Commissioner marks Anti-social (ASB) Behaviour Awareness Week 2023

Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) Andy Dunbobbin pledged his support to ASB Awareness Week with a walkaround in Rhyl, to hear more about how local officers in the town are working to reduce ASB and other forms of crime in the town.

ASB is defined as behaviour where a person's or group's actions causes annoyance, suffering or trouble to a specific person or group or to the wider community, and examples can include vandalism, vehicle nuisance, street drinking and inappropriate behaviour by neighbours.

The Commissioner was led on a walk around the town centre by local Inspector Kevin Smith of North Wales Police and was also joined by Cllr Rhys Thomas, Lead Member for Housing and Communities on Denbighshire County Council. The three discussed the overall picture of crime in the Denbighshire Coastal area, which has seen a steady and welcome decline in offences over recent months.

Dangos Stori Olivia yn San Steffan

Ar ddydd Llun 10 Gorffennaf, rhannwyd stori Olivia Alkir, geneth ifanc o Ruthun, yn Portcullis House, Westminster. Roedd oddeutu 50 yn bresennol, gan gynnwys aelodau'r Tŷ Cyffredin a Thŷ'r Arglwyddi, ymgyrchoedd diogelwch ffyrdd, cynrychiolwyr o'r gwasanaethau brys, swyddfeydd Comisiynwyr Heddlu a Throsedd, a'r diwydiant yswiriant, gyda'r nod o wneud ffyrdd ein gwlad yn fwy diogel i bobl ifanc.

Mae Stori Olivia yn ffilm sy'n dweud am y digwyddiadau trasig ynghylch marwolaeth Olivia, 17, o Ruthun, a laddwyd ym mis Mehefin 2019 yn dilyn gwrthdrawiad a achoswyd gan ddau yrrwr ifanc yn rasio. Mae'r ffilm, sy'n cynnwys ei theulu, ffrindiau ac athrawon, wedi cael ei defnyddio mewn ysgolion er mwyn annog diogelwch ffyrdd a rhybuddio pobl ifanc am beryglon gyrru gwael.

Roedd y dangosiad arbennig hwn yn y Senedd yn gyfle i rannu'r neges o'r ffilm yn gyfle i rannu'r neges tu ôl i'r ffilm a'i thema allweddol sef diogelwch ar y ffyrdd. Olivia's Story shown at Westminster in campaign to make roads safer for young people

On Monday 10th July, the story of Ruthin teenager Olivia Alkir was shared at Portcullis House in Westminster with nearly 50 attendees, including Members of the House of Commons and House of Lords, road safety campaigners, representatives of the emergency services, Police and Crime Commissioners' offices, and the insurance industry, with the aim of making our country's roads safer for young people.

Olivia's Story is a film which tells the tragic events surrounding the death of 17-year-old Olivia from Ruthin, who was killed in June 2019 following a collision caused by two young drivers racing. The film, which features her family, friends, and schoolteachers, has been used in schools to encourage road safety and to warn young people of the dangers of poor driving.

This special screening in Parliament was an opportunity to share the message behind the film and its key theme of road safety. Olivia's mum, Jo Alkir, is campaigning for a black box to be fitted to every young person's car to monitor driving and to try and prevent further tragedies like Olivia's. [Read more here.](#)
