Cynhadledd nodedig yn edrych ar sut i helpu a gwarchod plant a phobl ifanc

Ar 9 Tachwedd, gwnaeth dros 100 o weithwyr proffesiynol ac arbenigwyr yn eu maes ddod at ei gilydd yng Nghanolfan Fusnes Conwy yng Nghyffordd Llandudno er mwyn trafod sut i helpu plant a phobl ifanc sy'n profi cam-drin domestig, trais rhywiol a chaethwasiaeth fodern yng Ngogledd Cymru yn well. Trefnwyd y digwyddiad, Pawb yn Un, gan Swyddfa Comisiynydd Heddlu a Throsedd (SCHTh) Gogledd Cymru sef Andy Dunbobbin.

Bellach yn ei hail flwyddyn, roedd Pawb yn Un yn canolbwyntio ar blant a phobl ifanc. Edrychodd ar sut allen nhw gael eu helpu mewn sefyllfaedd cymhleth, boed fel dioddefwyr eu hunain, neu drwy fyw mewn amgylchfyd lle mae achosion o gam-drin domestig, trais rhywiol a chaethwasiaeth fodern yn digwydd.

Roedd y gynulleidfa'n cynnwys cynrychiolwyr o'r gwasanaethau brys, cynghorau lleol, gwasanaethau cymdeithasol ac iechyd, timau tai ac addysg, elusennau, a gwasanaethau cymorth. Landmark conference looks at how to support and protect children and young people

On November 9, over 100 professionals and experts in their field gathered together at Conwy Business Centre in Llandudno Junction to discuss how to better support children and young people experiencing domestic abuse, sexual violence and modern slavery in North Wales. The event, named All for One, was organised by the office of the Police and Crime commissioner (PCC) for North Wales, Andy Dunbobbin.

Now in its second year, All for One focused on children and young people and looked at how they can be supported in complex situations, whether as victims themselves, or through living in an environment where incidents of domestic abuse, sexual violence and modern slavery are happening.

Audience members included representatives from the emergency services, local councils, social and health services, housing and education teams, charities and support services, all of whom can encounter issues around domestic abuse, sexual violence and modern slavery in the course of their jobs. Prosiectau cymunedol yn cael eu hannog i ymgeisio am gyfran o gronfa £60k

Mae menter Eich Cymuned, Eich Dewis, hefo help Swyddfa Comisiynydd Heddlu a Throsedd Gogledd Cymru, Heddlu Gogledd Cymru (HGC) ac Ymddiriedolaeth yr Heddlu a'r Gymuned Gogledd Cymru (PACT) yn dychwelyd ar gyfer 2023-24. Mae cyfanswm mawr o £60,000 ar gael i brosiectau cymunedol ledled Gogledd Cymru. Mae Eich Cymuned, Eich Dewis yn noddi prosiectau ar lawr gwlad sy'n dod â phobl a sefydliadau at ei gilydd, hefo'r nod o greu amgylchfyd saffach i bawb.

Dathlodd Eich Cymuned, Eich Dewis 10 mlynedd o ariannu prosiectau yn 2023. Dros y cyfnod hwnnw mae cyfanswm o £547.705 wedi'i roi i 174 o brosiectau ar draws Gogledd Cymru yn gweithio er mwyn helpu'r blaenoriaethau yng Nghynllun Heddlu a Throsedd y Comisiynydd.

Mae'r arian sydd ar gael i'r prosiectau buddugol ar gyfer rownd nesaf y fenter yn £60,000, a gaiff ei rannu ar draws 21 prosiect. Gall grwpiau cymunedol ym mhob sir ymgeisio am hyd at £2,500. Community projects urged to apply for share of £60k fund

The Your Community, Your Choice initiative, supported by the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC), North Wales Police (NWP) and North Wales Police and Community Trust (PACT) returns for 2023-24, with a grand total of £60,000 available for community projects across North Wales. Your Community, Your Choice (YCYC) sponsors grass-roots projects that bring people and organisations together with the aim of creating a safer environment for all.

Your Community Your Choice celebrated ten years of funding projects in 2023, and over that time a total of £547.705 has been awarded to 174 projects across North Wales working to support the priorities in the Commissioner's Police and Crime Plan.

The funding available to winning projects for the next round of the initiative is £60,000, which will be shared across 21 projects. Community groups in each county can apply for up to £2,500 and organisations working across three or more counties are able to apply for up to £5,000. [Read more on how to apply here.](#)

Lansio prosiect newydd er mwyn helpu pobl ifanc daclo hiliaeth

Mae Dangos y Cerdyn Coch i Hiliaeth, sy'n elusen addysg gwrth-hiliaeth, wedi sicrhau cyllid gan Andy Dunbobbin ar gyfer prosiect er mwyn tacllo hiliaeth yn y rhanbarth. Mae cyllid ar gyfer y prosiect yn dod o fenter Arloesi i Dyfu'r Comisiynydd, sy'n helpu ffyrdd newydd ac arloesol o ddatrys y problemau a all arwain yn aml at ymddygiad troseddol mewn cymunedau.

Nod y prosiect, sef enw Leaders of Now, ydy herio hiliaeth drwy alluogi sgysiau parhaus o fewn ysgolion uwchradd am hiliaeth ac atal hiliaeth. Bydd y prosiect yn cael ei arwain gan ddisgyblion a'i deilwra i bob grŵp ysgol er mwyn helpu pobl ifanc deimlo'n hyderus wrth herio hiliaeth o fewn eu hardaloedd eu hunain a mynd ati i fod yn erbyn hiliaeth yn eu cymunedau.

Y bwriad ydy i Dangos y Cerdyn Coch i Hiliaeth weithio hefo pedair ysgol uwchradd yn Sir y Fflint, hefo bob ysgol hefo'r hawl i anfon pum disgybl ar y cwrs. Y disgyblion sy'n gyfrifol, ond maen nhw'n cael arweiniad gan Dangos y Cerdyn Coch i Hiliaeth. Mae'n rhoi amser i ddisgyblion drafod ac adlewyrchu ar wrth hiliaeth mewn lle a rennir ac yna cymell newid o fewn eu hysgolion eu hunain. Gwnaiff y tîm weithio'n uniongyrchol hefo disgyblion hŷn er mwyn eu helpu nhw ddod yn arweinwyr gwrth-hiliaeth yn yr ysgol. Ond y gobaith ydy bydd plant o bob blwyddyn yn yr ysgol uwchradd yn elwa. Gorchwyl allweddol i lysgenhadon fydd sefydlu grwpiau gwrth hiliaeth mewn ysgolion, sy'n agored i bob oed. [Darllenwch fwy yma.](#)



Project launches to help young people tackle racism

Anti-racism education charity, Show Racism the Red Card, has secured funding Andy Dunbobbin for a project to tackle racism in the region. Money for the project comes from the PCC's Innovate to Grow fund, which supports new and innovative ways of solving problems that can often lead to criminal behaviour in communities.

The project, called Leaders of Now, aims to challenge racism by enabling ongoing conversations within secondary schools about racism and anti-racism. The project will be pupil-led and tailored to each school group to help young people feel confident in challenging racism within their own spaces and to be actively anti-racist in their communities.

The plan is for Show Racism the Red Card to work with four secondary schools in Flintshire, with each school entitled to send up to five pupils on the course. Ownership lies with the pupils, but is guided by Show Racism the Red Card. It allows pupils time to discuss and reflect on anti-racism in a shared space and to then drive change within their own schools. The team will work directly with older pupils to support them in becoming anti-racist leaders in the school space, but they hope that children from every year group in the secondary school will benefit, as a key task for the ambassadors will be to set up in-school anti-racism groups, open to all ages. Eisoes trefnwyd gwibdeithiau, digwyddiadau, ymgyrchoedd codi arian a ffyrdd eraill o helpu'r gymuned; yn ddiweddar, er enghraifft cynhaliwyd Parti Calan Gaeaf ar gyfer y plant yng nghanolfan Trinity. PCC meets group helping King's Road regain its crown


On November 7, Andy Dunbobbin visited King's Road in West Shore, Llandudno to meet members of the Friends of King's Road, a recently formed group which is working to improve the area's amenities for local residents and change past perceptions of the street among some in the town.

The group is very much a community-based and community-led organisation. It was founded in May this year as a self-governing, not-for-profit, voluntary community group to make a positive change in the area. Among activities it has organised so far are days out, events, fundraisers and other ways of benefiting the community; most recently, for example, by holding a Halloween Party for local children at the Trinity Centre.
